Brian Stauss and Henry Simon shared information about tool sales.

For Show and Tell: Brian Stauss showed a baby crib he made; Craig Bond showed scroll saw puzzles and toys that he makes; Tom Gustafson showed a zigzag box made of cherry, walnut, and maple and shared the instructions; Mike Parsons showed his shaker box and basket; and Joe Perret brought in his pizza peel made from maple, walnut, and mahogany. Dale Mahnke showed Christmas trees made out of pine with a natural edge stabilized using thin CA glue; Dale also showed a vase made out of cedar and stabilized in vacuum using cactus juice; Rick Garey showed a table he made using southern live oak with a live edge and metal legs which he welded using MIG welding; Rick dried the oak slab for four and one-half years and planed it with a router and jig; and Jack Terry showed a favorite staple puller that we have talked about previously.

Directions from Folsom (at LA-40):

Take LA-25 south for 8.4 mi to River Rd. (There will be a green sign saying "St. Joesph Seminary" just before River Rd.)

Turn left onto River Rd and go east for 0.7 mi.

The entrance to the Abbey is on the left.

Take the single-lane bridge into the Abbey, turn right, go past the church, and turn left.

Proceed to the woodshop, which is in the second block on the left.

Directions from Covington and Slidell:

From I-12, take exit 63B US-190 W (Covington, Mandeville).

Travel north past Home Depot, Wal-Mart, and Lowes.

Stay on US-190 W as it turns into a two-lane road going over the Bogue Falaya River.

At the second traffic light, turn right onto LA-437 N (Lee Rd).

Go 0.8 miles and when you see a green sign on the right-hand side of the road saying "St. Joseph Seminary", immediately get into the middle turn lane and turn left onto River Rd.

Go 2.6 miles on River Rd to the entrance to the Abbey, on the right. Take the single-lane bridge into the Abbey, turn right, go past the church, and turn left.


Proceed to the woodshop, which is in the second block on the left.
