Agenda: We will take a video tour of Mel Bourne's shop.

The November meeting was called to order at 7 pm on November 17, 2020 by Bob Busfield over Zoom.

Since there is no Boat Festival this year, the guild has accepted an invitation to make gifts for the foster children in the James Samaritan program. Rick and Kathleen Garey said to give them a call and they will pick up the children's gifts. Bob asked that participants carbon copy him.

Bob called for woodworking questions. Tom Gustafson was asked how he connected the 2 1/2-inch hose from his drill press dust collector to the 4-inch hose. Tom uses a 4" to 2 1/2" blast gate with a wall bracket.

For Show 'n Tell, Jack Terry showed us a cypress bird house he built using his brother-in-law's design. The house has 25 pieces. Joe Perrett showed a small version of a carpenter bee trap. Dale Mahnke said he also uses a carpenter bee trap, and with a little sugar water in it, he has caught quite a few. Brian Harrell said he has used one too, and that he has a neighbor who uses a horse fly trap, although it is not made of wood. Joe also showed us a pagoda-style urn.

Following Show 'n Tell, we watched a video featuring Tom McGlaughlin demonstrating a 3-cut method to square up a table saw sled. The first cut gives a straight edge (#1). Then the piece is rotated so that #1 is on the fence, and the second cut is made (#2). Then the piece is flipped over and oriented such that #2 is on the fence, and the third cut is made (#3). The difference in length between #2 and #3, guides the adjustment of the fence.

Bob urged everyone to stay safe as he closed the guild activities until the new year.


