Direction to Harland's Shop


124 Pine Avenue, Madisonville Ph. 985 845-3468

From Madisonville: west 5 miles on Hwy 22 to Hwy 1085; north 0.5 mile to Brewster Ave; turn right, 300 yds to Whispering Timbers subdivision, turn right; turn right at Pine Avenue (first corner); 124 is first house on left.


From Covington: I-12 west to exit 57; 0.5 mile north to Hwy 1085, turn left; 3.8 miles southwest to Brewster Ave; turn left, 300 yds to Whispering Timbers.


St. Tammany Woodworkers' Guild
